Importance of Voting

Voting is the process of choosing who will rule India, a country that preaches Unity in Diversity. People elect those who will rule them and improve their lives and people make them win by voting. India became independent in 1947. Freed from the rule of foreigners, it formed its own government and got the right to rule. All the leaders of India came together and wanted India to become a republic. It was decided to create a golden opportunity for the people of the country to elect their representatives and form the government. They accepted the principle of government of the people, by the people and for the people. Accordingly, elections are held once every five years to elect the representatives. India has a President, who is also elected once every five years.

Delhi, the capital of India, has its own State Legislature. Central government rules India. This is our democratic or republican government.

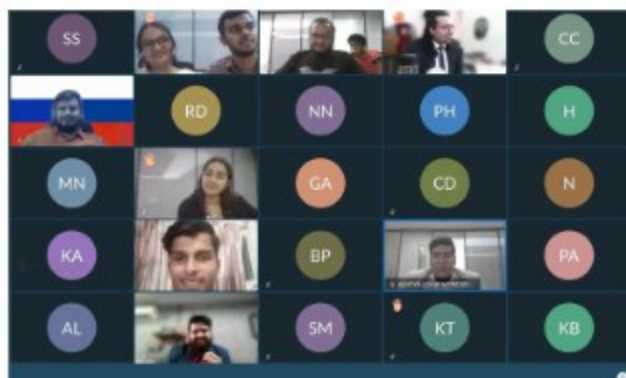
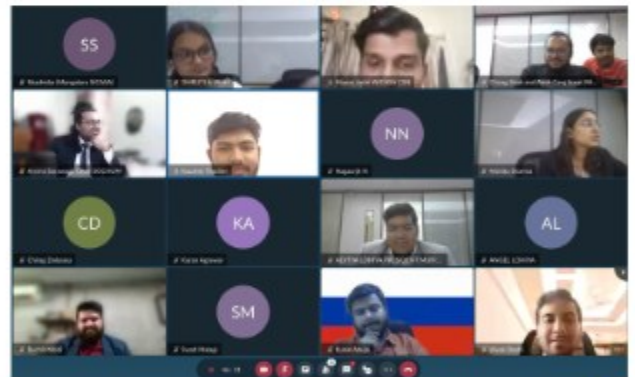
THE MODEL UNITED NATIONS

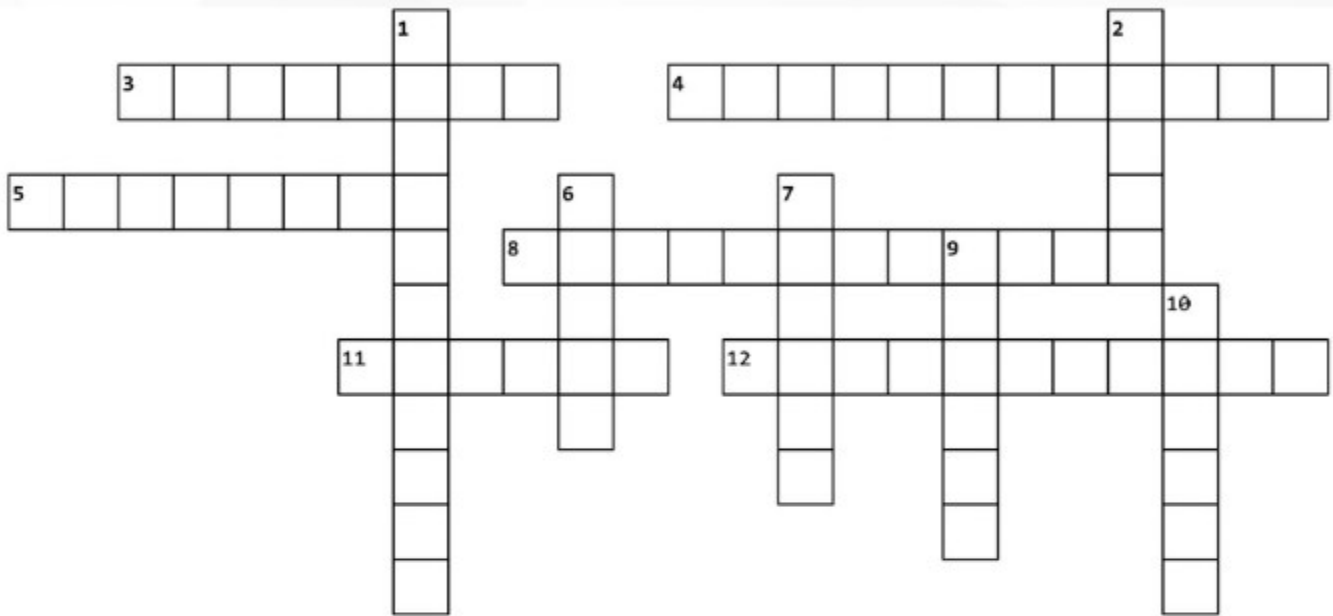
